Competitions – Season 2016-17

English Amateur Championship

The most important event in the EASB calendar the oldest amateur snooker competition in the World. Its roll of honour reads like a who's who of snooker nobility.

The winner will represent England in the World Amateur Championships, European Championships and Home Internationals Seniors Team. The runner up will automatically be selected for the European Snooker Championship and will be first in line should the winner not take his place in the World Amateur Championship, or if further places are made available to England.

English Amateur Tour

Second in status only to the English Amateur Championship this Competition is designed to attract the best amateurs in the country playing in the best conditions. Players who aspire to achieving Main Tour status will see this as an excellent and affordable opportunity to gain valuable top match-play experience.

For each event the winner will receive £1000 + entry fee to World Snooker Q-School 2017 (guaranteed)

The two highest ranked eligible players at the end of the season will be nominated to participate in World Snooker's English Open Championship.

The top-ranked players at the end of the Tour will represent England in the World and European Team Championships. Along with the current English Amateur Champion, the current champion of the English Amateur Tour will represent England in the World and European Snooker Championships. Any further places allocated by the IBSF or EBSA will be offered first to the English Amateur Runner-Up and then down the ranking list for this tour series. The qualification to World and European Men's Championships provides a route to the Main Tour. Along with the current champions of the English Amateur and Under 40s Championships the Home Internationals Seniors Team will be selected from the highest ranked eligible players from this series.



Competitions – Season 2016-17

Premier Junior Tour

This is a six-event tour comprising a maximum of 40 players who have previously qualified. The bottom eight players eligible to play on the 2017-18 Tour will have to compete in the Junior play-offs in order to keep their position on the Premier Junior Tour. Any player who fails to compete in at least three Premier Tour events will not be eligible to play on next season's tour. The final ranking list will be made up of the best five results.

Regional Junior Tour

A series of Regional Events for young players looking to develop onto the Premier Junior Tour. At the end of the season, the top ranked players in each region, based upon a proportional number of total entries in each region, will be eligible for automatic promotion to compete on the 2017/18 Premier Junior Tour, whilst additional players from each region will be invited to enter the Junior Play-Offs, depending how many places are available.

Under-40 Championship

A competition to find the most talented under 40-year-old snooker player in the country. The winner will represent England in the Home Internationals Seniors Team.

Under-40 Tour

This is a six-event regional tour (North East, North West, Midlands, South East, South West) for those who do not wish to pursue the more likely routes to the professional tour. The overall winner of the rankings at the end of the season will represent England in the EBSA European Team Championship, and will receive a scholarship with free entry to selected EASB events for the 2017-18 season.

Masters Championship

You may be over 40 but you consider yourself a top league player and are looking to challenge yourself further. So take on the most experienced amateurs in the country to see if you can become the Masters Champion of England.

The winner will be invited to the IBSF World Masters Team Championship, IBSF World Masters Championship, EBSA European Masters Championship (Singles and Team) and the Home Internationals Masters Team. The runner-up will be automatically invited to the European Masters Championship (Singles and Team), and will be first in line for other events should the winner not accept his place or should additional entries be made available to England.

Masters Tour

This is a six-event regional tour (North East, North West, Midlands, South East, South West). The final regional ranking list will be made up of the best five results with the top players from each region, based on representation proportionate to entries, progressing to a National Last 16 stage to determine the overall national rankings.

The highest ranked eligible players will represent England at The IBSF World Masters and World Masters Team Championships, the EBSA European Masters and European Masters Team Championships, and the Home Internationals Masters Team Championship, to fill any places after selection from the Masters and Over 55s Championships.

Over-55 Championship

You may be over 55 but you consider yourself a good league player and are looking to challenge yourself further. So take on the most experienced masters in the country to see if you can become the Over-55s Champion of England.

The winner will represent England in the Home Internationals Masters Team.

Under-14 Championship

*A competition to find the most talented under 14-year-old snooker player in the country
The winner will represent England in the Home Internationals Under 16s Team.*

Under-16 Championship

*A competition to find the most talented under 16-year-old snooker player in the country.
The winner will represent England at the World Under 18s Championship, The European Under 18s Championship and the Home International Under 16s Team.*

Under-18 Championship

*A competition to find the most talented under 18-year-old snooker player in the country.
The winner will represent England at the World Under 18 Championship, the European Under 18 Championship and the Home Internationals Under 21s Team. The runner up will automatically be selected for the European Under 18 Championship and will be first in line should the winner not take his place in the World Under 18 Championship, or if further places are made available to England.*

Under-21 Championship

*A competition to find the most talented under 21-year-old snooker player in the country.
The winner will represent England at the World Under 21 Championship, the European Under 21 Championship and the Home Internationals Under 21 Team. The runner up will automatically be selected for the European Under 21 Championship and will be first in line should the winner not take his place in the World Under 21 Championship, or if further places are made available to England.*

Ladies Championship

A competition to find the best English Ladies snooker player in the country and is open to any female Elite, Individual, Junior, County and Club Member. There is no age restriction.

6 Reds Championship

Quirky and exciting, anything can happen with 6-Reds, a bit of fun but reach the Final of this event and you'll represent England in the IBSF/EBSA Six Reds Championship.

The winner and runner-up will both represent England at the IBSF and EBSA 6-Reds Championships.
